Level Up

- To advance or improve (oneself, someone else, or something) in or as if in a game.
- Leveling up means to set strategic goals that allow you to enhance your life and/or others lives around you.
- Anyone who has grown up with video games knows that a lot of them come with a structural hierarchy of progress. You find the tomb, you defeat the monster, you collect the loot and maybe the clue to the next part of the journey, and then you move on to the next level. It's a simple, graspable way to assess where you are in contrast with where you need to be.

Many Christians (most?) can identify events or moments in their spiritual journey in which they have increased their faith or knowledge or capacity to serve. They probably do not use the term, but they have "leveled up." Sometimes these occasions are by intent: we take a class, we read a book,

we join a small group, etc. Other times, these occasions of leveling up seem random: an accident happens, a person serves as an inspiration in the midst of their trauma, one's path crosses that of another who contributes something that we've not known was missing. Quite a few times I've heard someone say, "It was the most difficult thing I've ever experienced, but I wouldn't change it for anything because it brought me closer to God." Yes, even our worst times can bring us to level up.

I am thankful for the ways that God has prepared me to serve in the calling that God has placed before me. I've been to seminary. I've taken Continued Education classes. I've been to counseling. I've made mistakes from which I've learned. I've sat with the sick and dying — family, friends, parishioners, and strangers. I've taught classes and learned new things in preparation to lead other learners. I've seen truly good and lovely people crash and burn, and I've learned from watching their errors unfold. I've also learned by watching some folks flourish and bring others along with them.

Here's the thing: I've still got so much to learn. There's a part of a hymn that I heard some years ago that rings true for me on every occasion of my hearing it. "I'm not what I ought to be. I'm better than I used to be. I'm getting better all the time." I continue to grow and learn and develop. I hope that will remain true until I leave this mortal life behind.

At church board meetings, I sometimes inquire of board members as to what they are doing to "level up" their leadership skills and abilities. I offer resources from time to time. Leveling up is not just for pastors and board members. It's for you, too! What are you doing to lift your spiritual journey to the next level? Here's an opportunity: On September 14, there will be a Inquirers/New Members/Member Refresher class beginning. It will be on Sundays after worship and a brief time of Fellowship. Location will depend on the number of participants, but join me in the outer Pastor's Office to start. Bring your refreshments with you. I'd like to know in advance how many to plan for, so please let me know if you intend to join the class. It should run about an hour each time.

If we get parents of young children involved, we will work on child care and/or nursery availability. You can begin preparing for the class by reading "The Moravian Covenant for Christian Living" It can be found online at https://www.moravian.org/2018/06/moravian-covenant-for-christian-living/ or I can give you a paper copy.

As individuals and as a congregation, let's LEVEL UP together!

Elders Report from July 2025 meeting:

The Elders gathered on August 11 with seven members present. A devotion was presented to open the meeting. Minutes from the July meeting were reviewed. Future events on the church calendar were reviewed and discussed. Composition of the Nominating Committee was discussed and two Elders were joined to that group. Northern Province Synod 2026 was discussed. Ongoing discussion was held around the idea that New Dorp could host fellowship time with refreshments following the UBC Annual meeting. Ideas were shared with the hope of holding Vacation Bible School (VBS) next summer, perhaps as a joint venture with other Moravian churches on the island. A new Area Director of Faith Formation appointed by the Eastern District Executive Board for our area begins work at the end of August. He is from the Great Kills congregation and his name is Todd Hallett. We agreed to engage Todd around the idea of joint VBS. Thoughts on how we welcome folks among us at our various events and what our expectations might be for them were expressed. A gender inclusion training opportunity was shared (this will be required of all Northern Province clergy). The meeting was closed with prayer. Trustees Report

During the months of June and July the Trustees had overseen the new ADA bathroom installation for the Parish House, which has now been completed. Our Trash to Treasure (T-T) outreach program has realized the best performance over the past 3 months with this past month realizing approximately \$1300. We have also seen several frequent T to T visitors attending our Sunday Services. Bob ladorola had an associated yard sale resulting in sales that he adjusted between NDMC and a donation to Tunnel to Towers on behalf of NDMC. He has also connected with the New Hope Christian Church in West Brighton

and as a result they had received baby goods and general medicine cabinet type supplies. New Dorp Moravian Church yard signs are now available and a donation for the sign would be appreciated. The last of the clothing from our past clothing drives have been delivered to Ghana for distribution. Fire extinguishers have been inspected in the church buildings and Parish House and those requiring replacement are under a contract currently in place for inspection and replacement as needed. An updated Fire Alarm Panel for the church has been approved and will be installed over the next month. The UBC will be providing the funding. Parish House rentals continue to do well and a Vendor Display Rental went very well. The organizers are looking to expand their involvement in future events. Our Benevolence for the Month of September is MORAVIAN DISASTER RESPONSE (MDR)

The MDR program of the Board of World Mission coordinates short-term mission efforts that support our partner provinces in times of need, as well as areas within our own borders where help in projects would be beneficial. Work crews have helped with repairs to buildings, placement of solar systems, replacement of hangars, and construction of churches and parsonages.

In addition to helping with ongoing needs in our provinces, BWM provides funds and teams to assist with ongoing disaster relief, both globally and within our borders.

The Board of World Mission recognizes that we cannot adequately mount a first-response in the face of a current disaster, and we generally focus on more long-term efforts to provide help with repairs. When a disaster occurs, our MDR coordinator will post a notice to the congregations to make them aware of any relief teams that might be forming.

We encourage that donations to cover disaster relief needs be designated for our general disaster relief account and not for a specific concern so that any excess might be used for subsequent needs.
